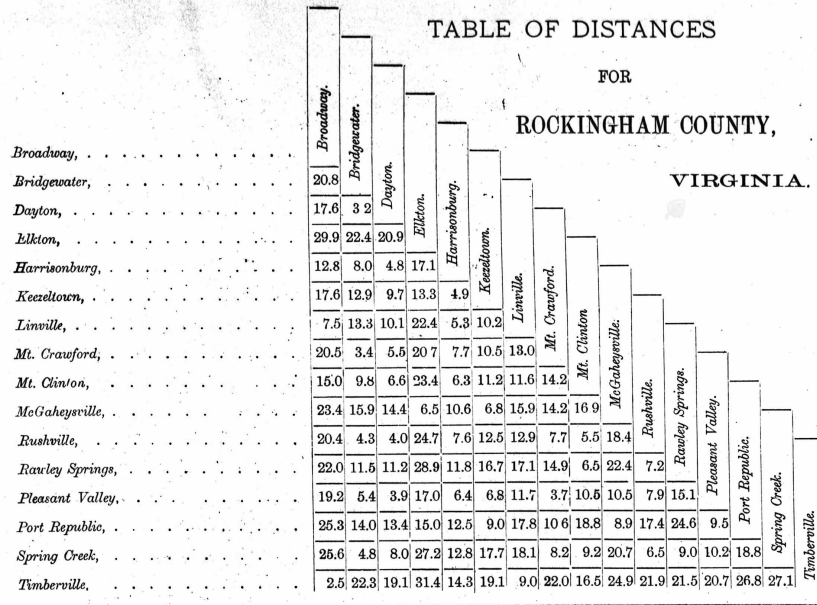

POPULATION OF ROCKINGHAM COUNTY, VIRGINIA.

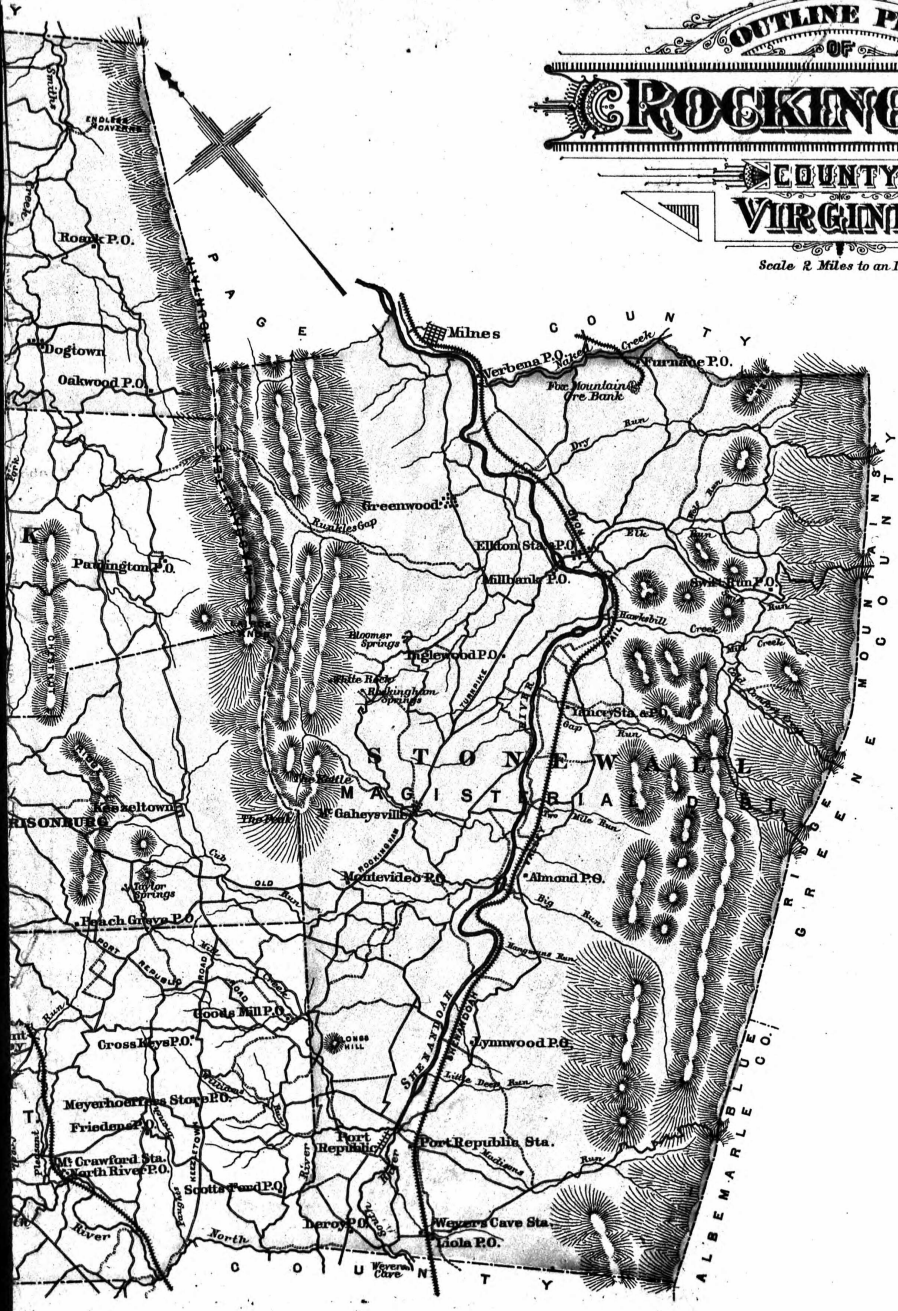

 Scale 2 Miles to an Inch.

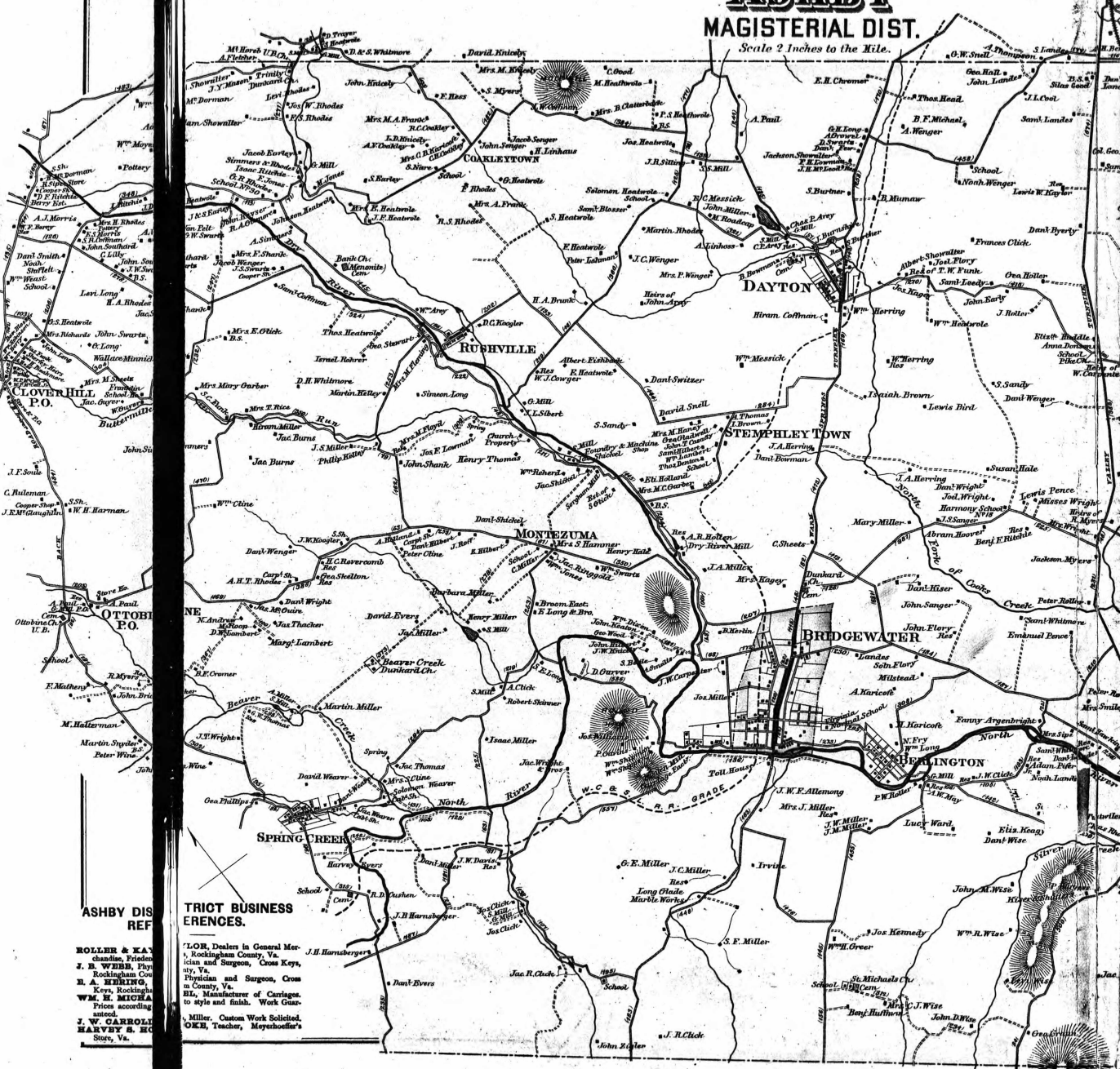

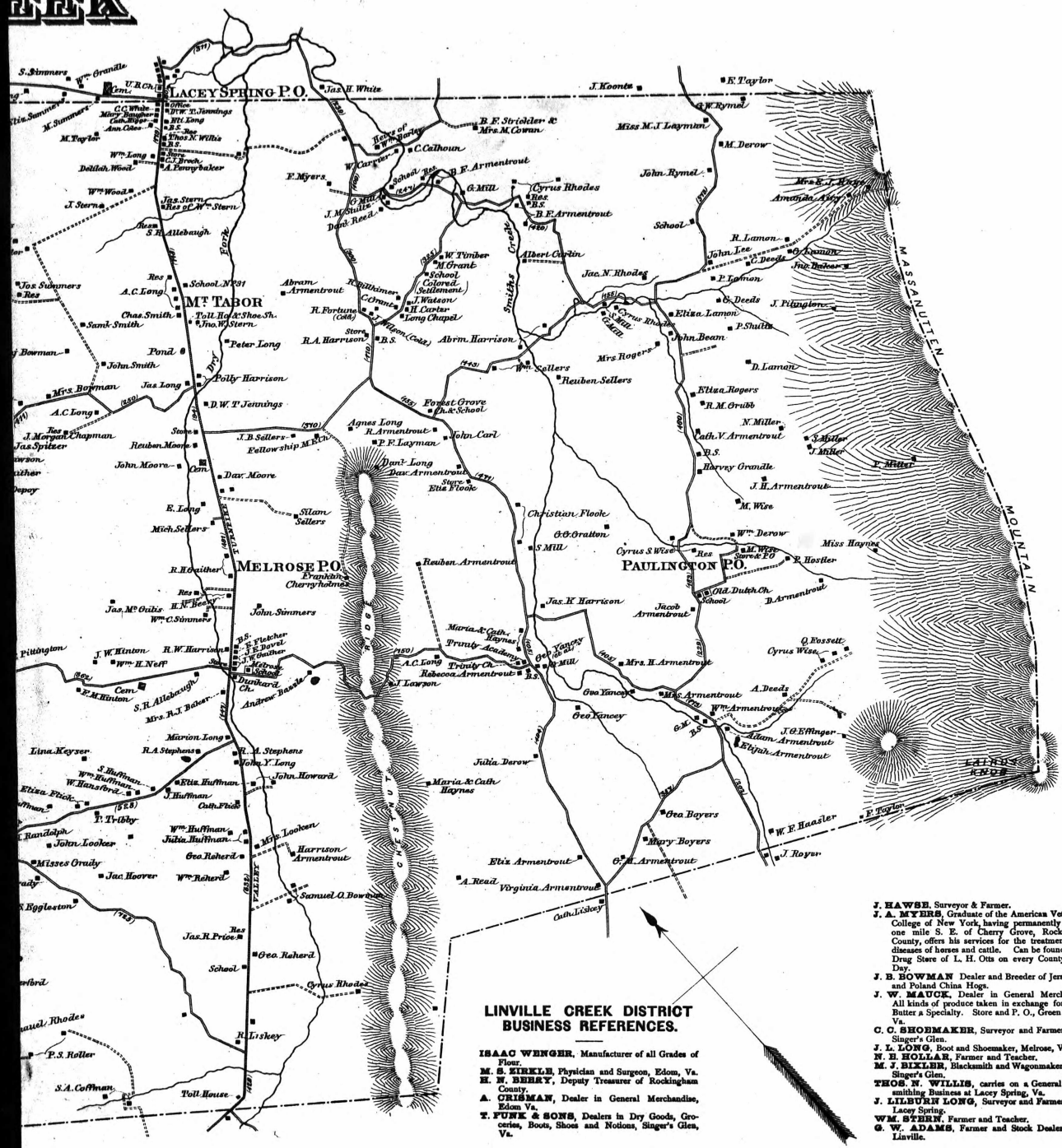


EAST PART OF LINVILLE CREEK MAGISTERIAL DIST.

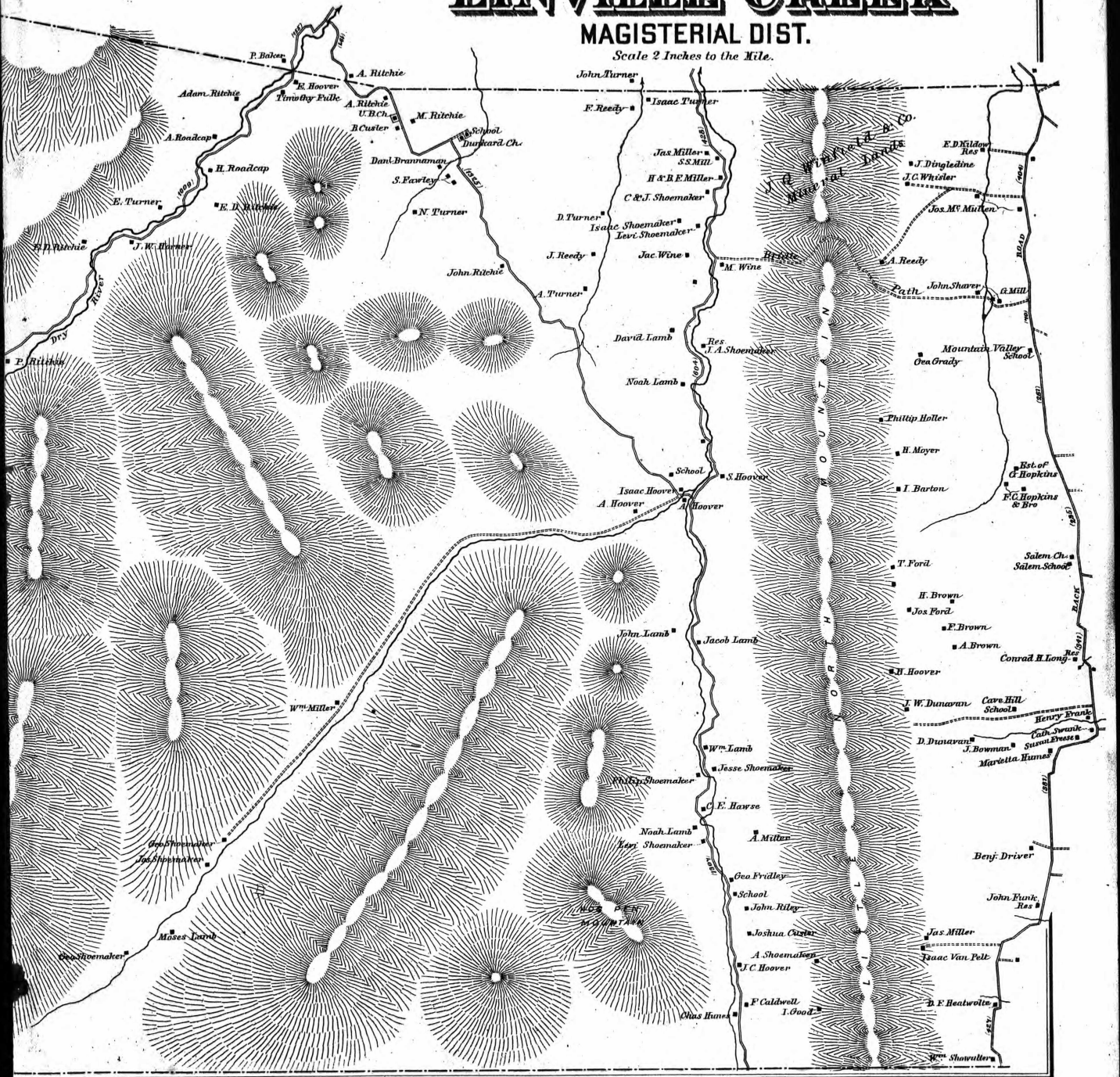

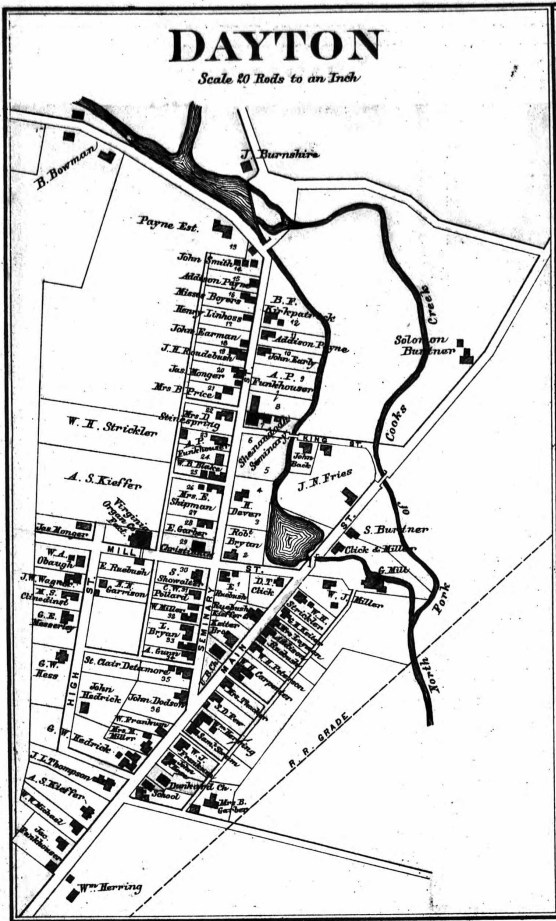


WEST PART OF LINVILLE CREEK MAGISTERIAL DIST.

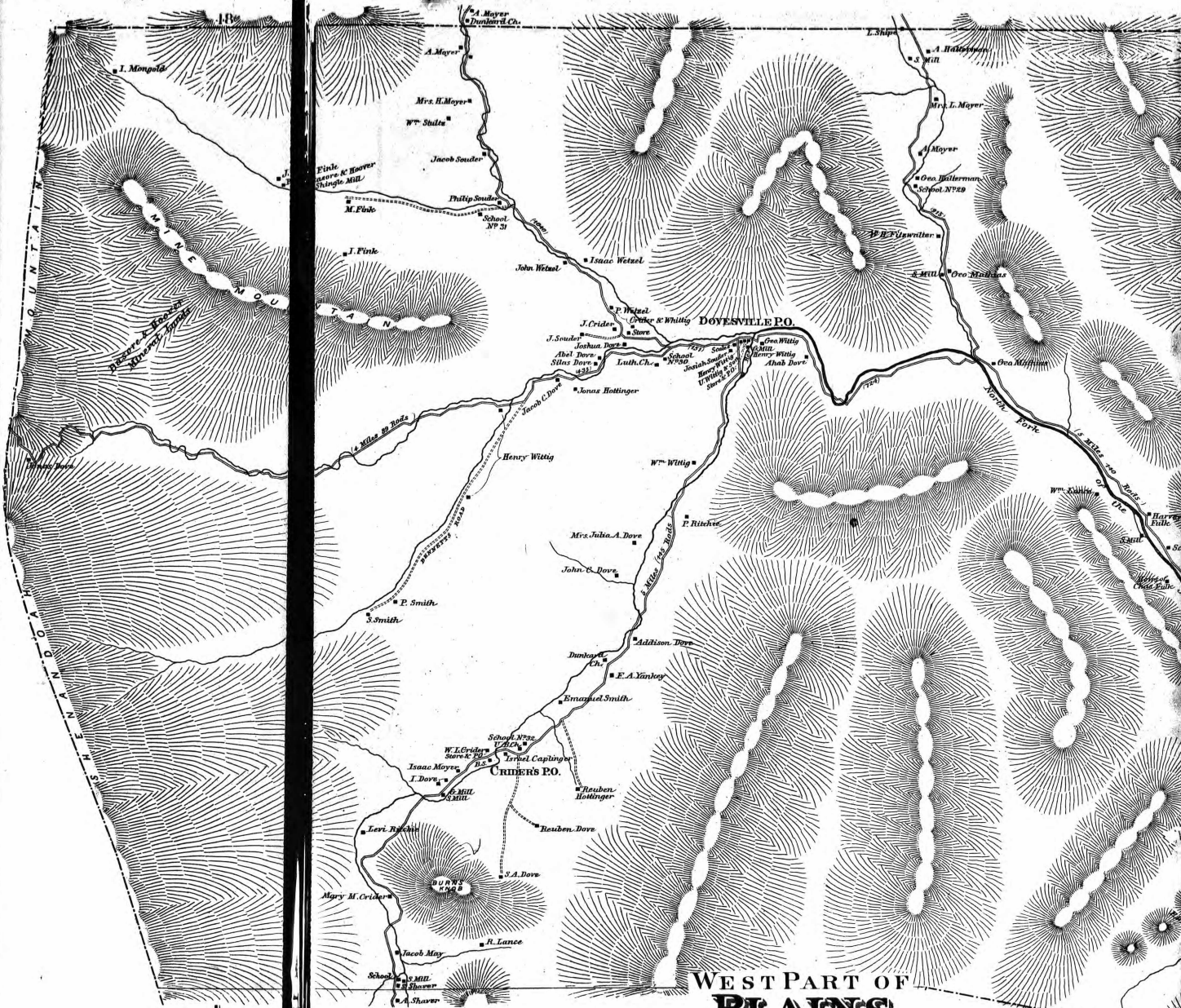
LACEY SPRING REFERENCE.

LACEY SPRING, VA., is pleasantly situated on the Valley turnpike, nine miles northeast of Harrisonburg. It is the centre of a densely populated and intelligent community. The private residences are notably good. It contains two dry goods stores, two blacksmith shops, one flouring-mill, a post office and a large and commodious school building, situated on an eminence commanding a fine view of the surrounding country. This institution has been conducted several years by Professor John W. Taylor, assisted by Professor Julius J. Martz and Mrs. F. Hunter. The various English branches, higher mathematics and ancient and modern languages are taught here. This school ranks as one of the best in the county.

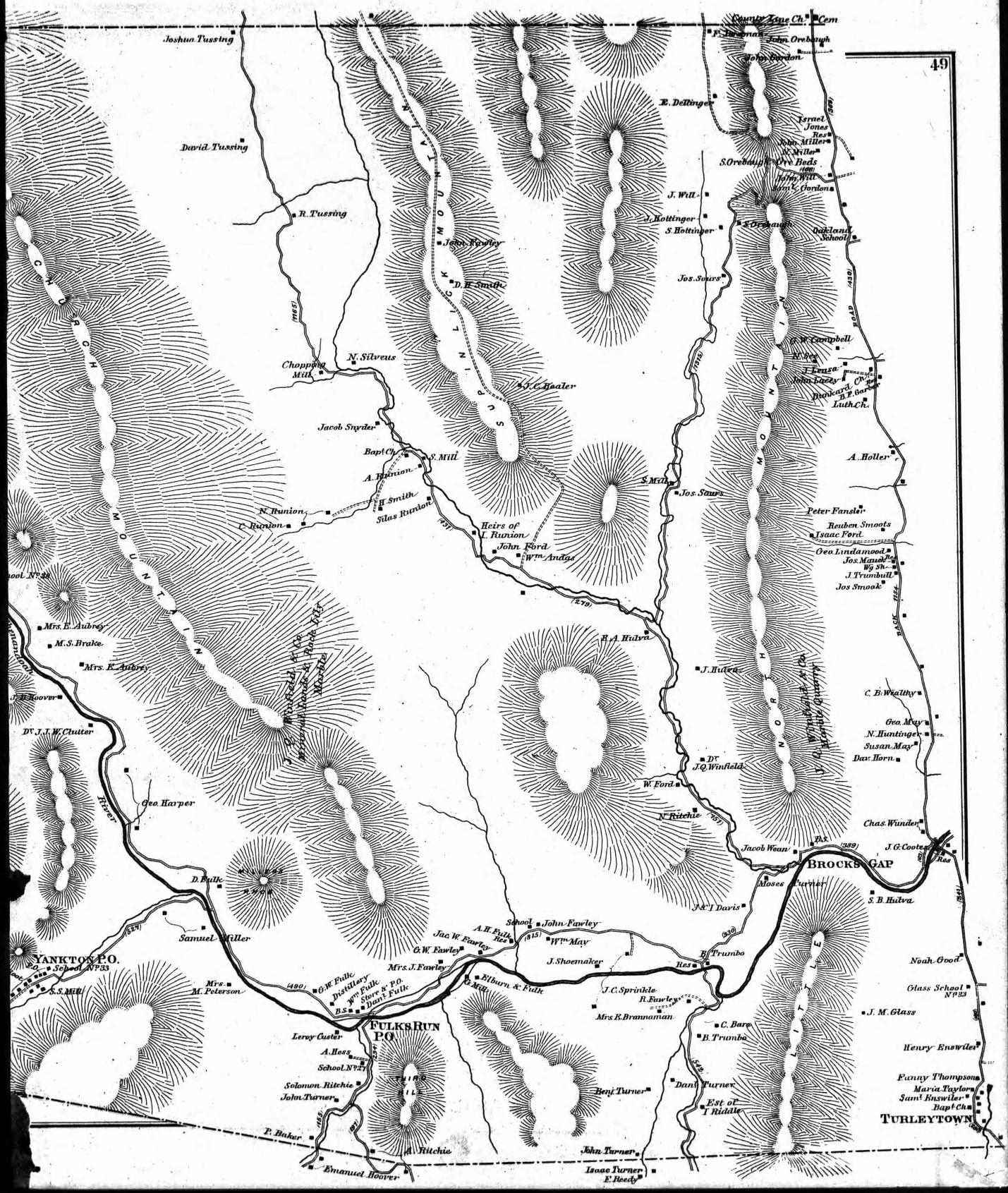
There is also at this place a very excellent church, well attended, under the auspices of the United Brethren in Christ.

A large fountain, Lacey Spring, from which the village takes its name, gushes forth from the base of the hill near the pike, affording a beautiful and never-failing supply of water.



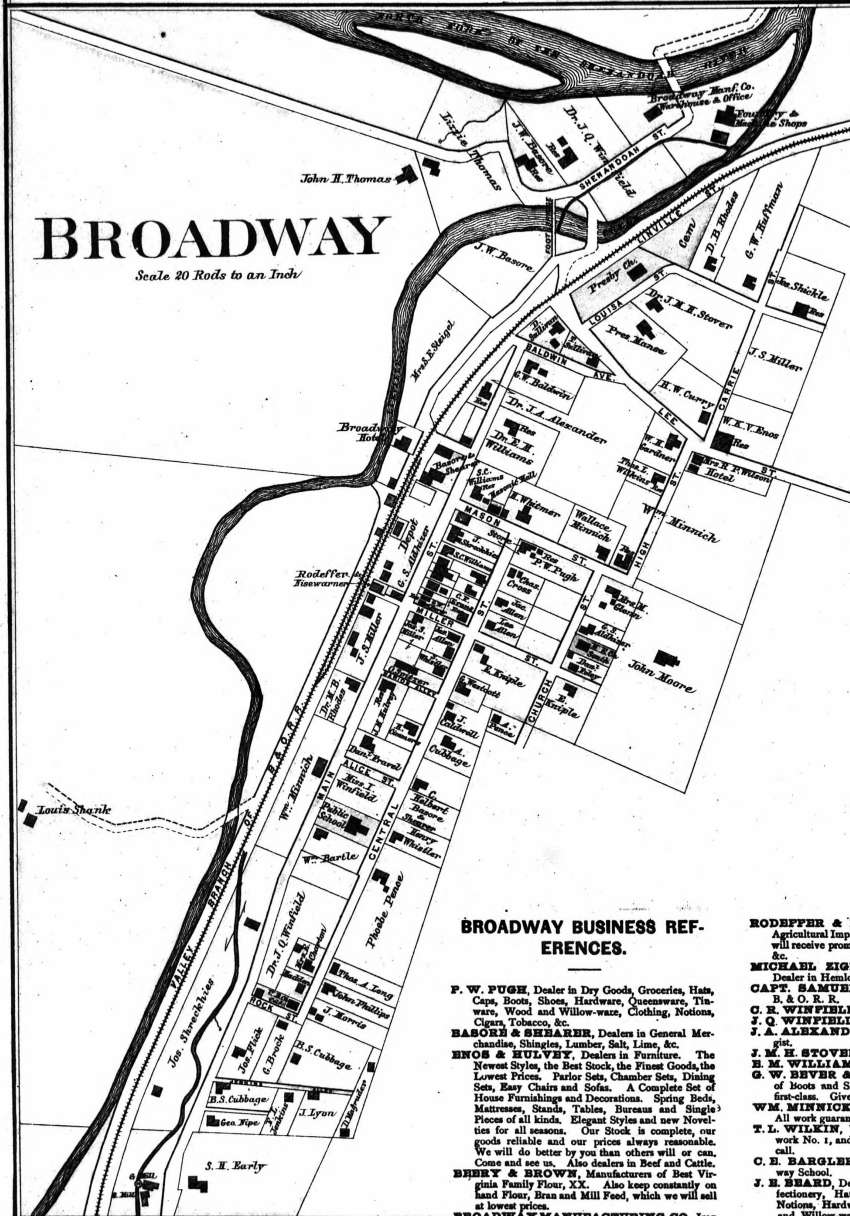


WEST PART OF

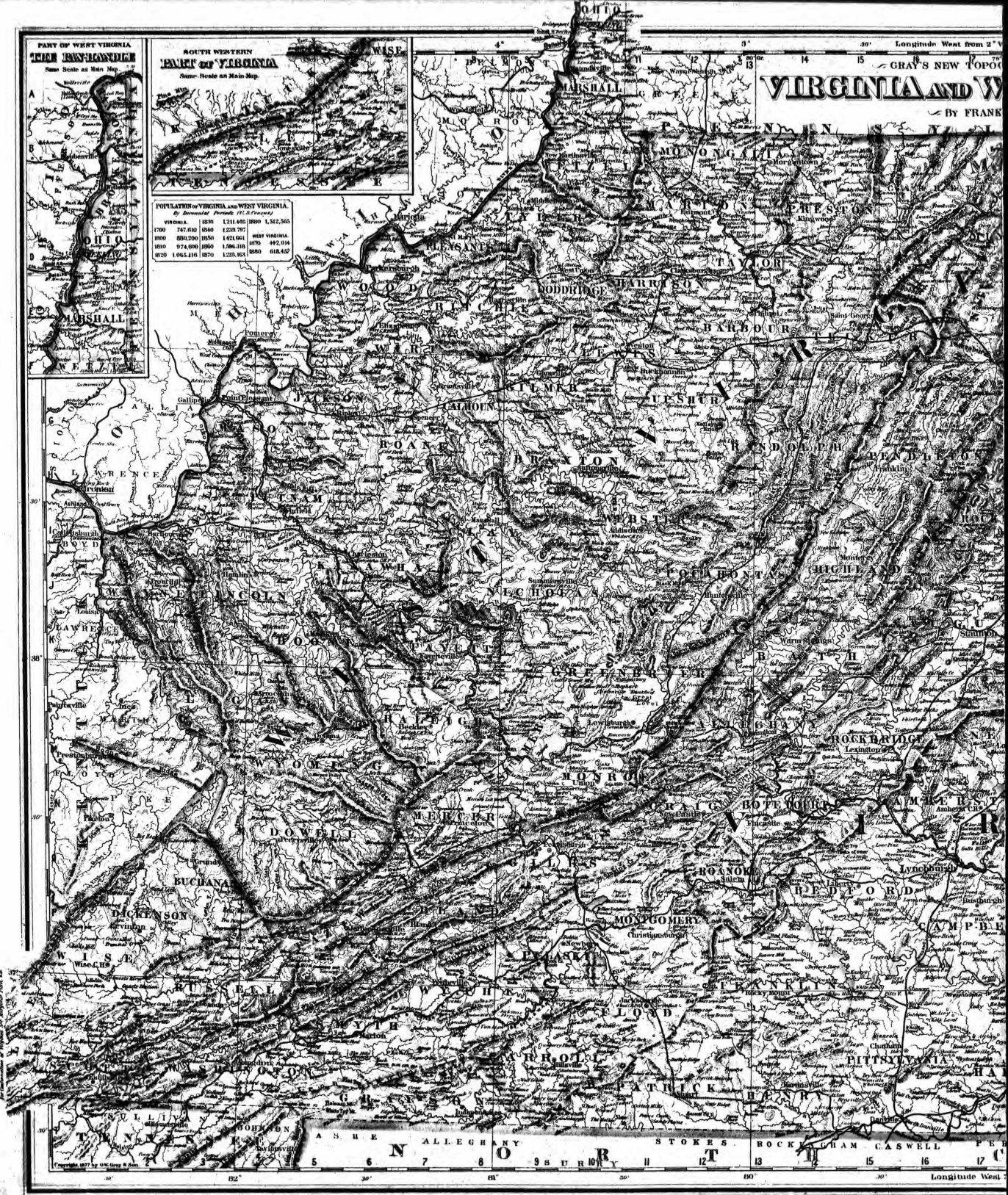

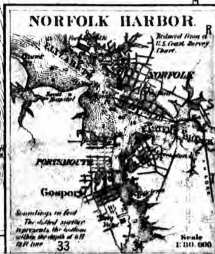
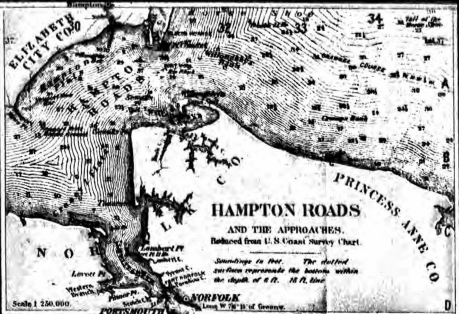
PHYSICAL MAP OF WEST VIRGINIA

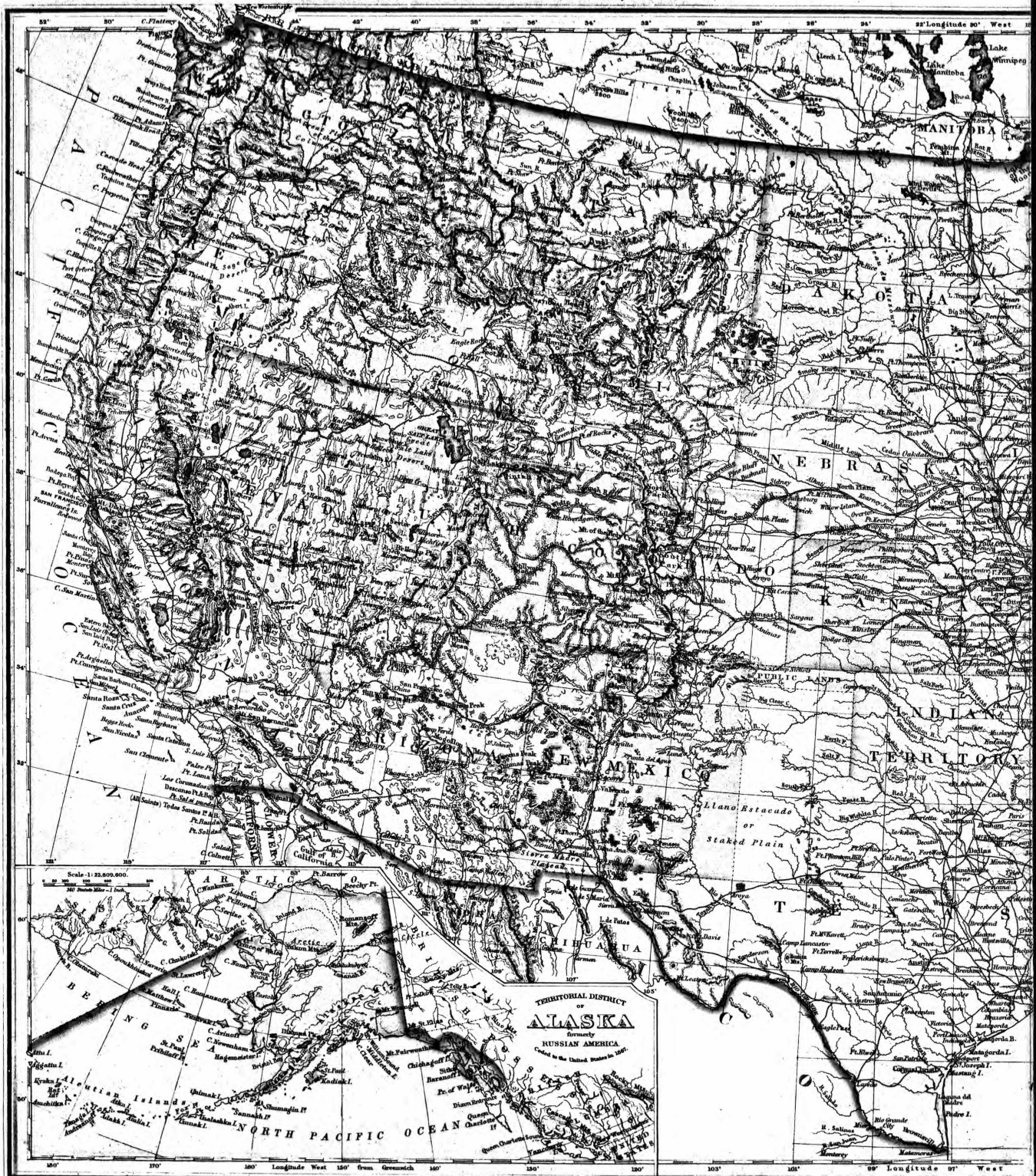

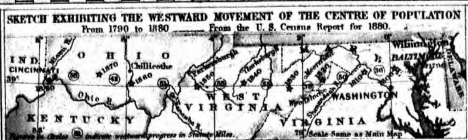

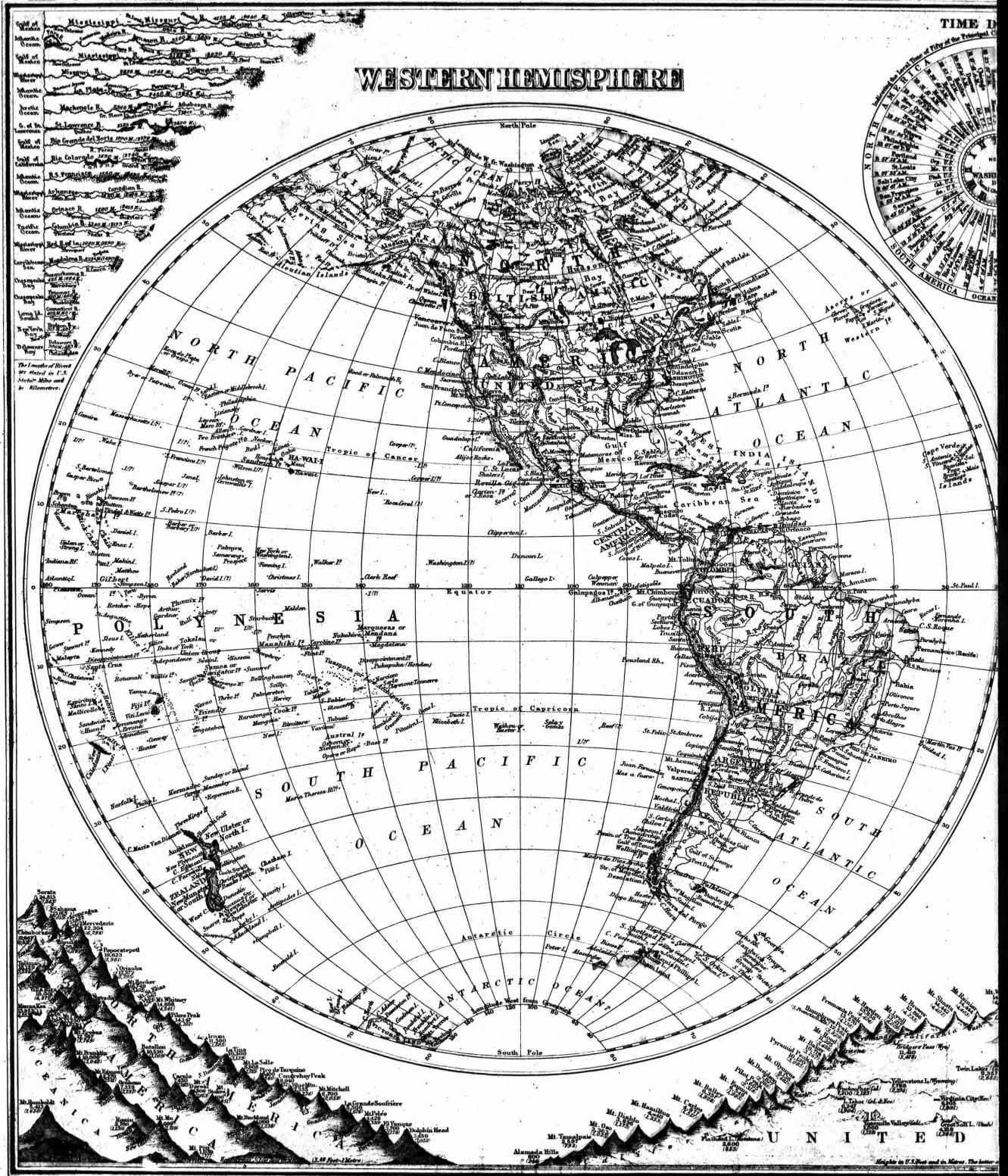

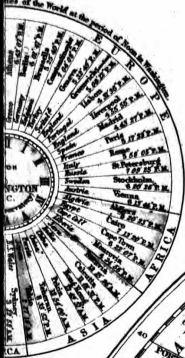
